News from Pastor Shawn

The Trinity Font and Altar—new to The Bridge

The Trinity font was designed to be a stand or table when not in use and to hold a single handmade ceramic bowl hidden inside for baptisms. Since it was built for our Bridge ministry, I wanted to incorporate a few unique qualities along with some traditional religious attributes.

The design is all about the numbers! Three woods, three legs, and a triangle. Even the circular top is all about the numbers! The circumference of the circular top can only be measured by using “pi,” which is a never ending or repeating number. All of which speaks volumes of our marvelous triune God!



In this contemporary design, the legs are flowing arcs that create the imagery of a bridge. Although, when a single board is used to create a leg, the shape itself would be very weak. By uniting the three as one, the legs actually become exceptionally strong! The circular top represents the unity and wholeness one receives through baptism. The small triangle in the center not only represents the holy Trinity, but it also serves as the major support for the entire structure. Just as our God, often unnoticed, quietly supports each of us every single day of our lives.

The woods are all hardwoods that are positioned in a way that emulates an Old Testament chiasm with the emphasis being in the middle. The species in the middle is Rosewood. It is a rare and exotic wood, and in this instance can only be seen when the lid is lifted for baptism and its beauty is exposed. The wood came from the lid of an antique square grand piano; age unknown. The outer two wood species are maple and oak, each known for their hardness and their notable grain qualities. Together, the three create a beautiful contrast of grain and color.

The altar expands upon the same triune theme using the same woods to create balance and beauty. The altar however, uses two sets of the tri-leg bases to support the alter top bridging the divide. Just as there is a bridge to cross the great divide in the center of it all, our loving God provides a cross to bridge the great divide for each of us.
